It is for this reason that our new facilities will offer a much larger Early Learning Centre, an activity centre specifically for children and young people with disabilities and several short-term accommodation residences

Over the years, St Anthony's Family Care has had the opportunity to support the inclusion of many children with additional needs within its Early Learning Centre.

While we aim to provide a safe and supportive environment for all our children, it is always nice to hear how we have made a positive difference in the lives of a family. It can often be challenging meeting the varying needs of the children in our care, as each and every child is unique, and developing their fullest potential is our greatest priority.

When a child with a disability accesses St Anthony's Early Learning Centre, the team engage their extensive skills and experience and provide the special attention necessary, to enable the children to progress and make developmental gains prior to commencing school.

Many of our families provide us with feedback about their experience at St Anthony's and it is a great source of motivation for the staff to hear that their work and dedication has not only been valued but has also made a real positive impact.

Over the last two years we had the pleasure of having Roman enrolled in our Early Learning Centre and we would like to take this opportunity to share the testimonial his mother sent us as Roman made his transition to school in January 2019.

"By the age of 4 my son was diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder and he appeared to have difficulties in a number of areas of daily life. Roman was also diagnosed with Global Development Delay.

Afterward, we started to review multiple child care centres that we thought would assist with Roman's needs and we really felt a connection with St Anthony's Family Care team.

St Anthony's Family Care is not an ordinary child care centre. This is the second home that we wanted to be part of and they became a vital part of our family.

St Anthony's Family Cares team developed necessary steps for Roman that helped him to learn both individual and independent skills and progressed him to the next level.

He received exceptional care and he has developed a strong bond with his educators and other children.

His educational progress and social development skills have excelled because of their excellent educational programs and support of the fantastic team.

By the age of 6, Roman was given a cognitive test that diagnosed Autism Spectrum Disorder but was no longer said to have global development delays. We will forever be grateful for the excellent and hard work of the team of SAFC for giving Roman a chance to lead a fulfilling life.

Today, Roman is a boy with a bright future that has given us hope."
